Meeting People

We use questions with Do you like ...? to ask how you feel about a place:

Do you like París?

We can also use What's/What are ... like? to ask what you know about other things in a place:

What's the city like?

What's the weather like?

What are the people like?

What's the food like?

ASKING PEOPLE ABOUT THEIR OPINION

What do you think about the food here? What is your opinion about this? What is your attitude towards.....?

INTRODUCING A FRIEND

This is my friend/husband/wife, brother, etc(say the name of the person).

ASKING A PERSON'S AGE

How old are you?

PEOPLE YOU BOTH KNOW IN COMMON

How do you know Carlos and Linda? Do you know Erick Jones? Are you friend of Edith?

WHERE PEOPLE LIVE

Where do you live? Do you live near here?

MEETING SOMEONE IN THE PAST

Didn't we meet in a conference last year? Where did you meet Xavier?

PEOPLE'S JOBS AND STUDIES

You're a student at the University, aren't you? What do you do?

ASKING IF THE PERSON IS FREE

Are you doing anything (this evening)? Do you have any plans for (this Friday)? What are you doing (on Saturday)?

MAKING SUGGESTION

I thought we could give (that Mexican restaurant) a try. I am PRO pancakes. How about you? Do you feel like (going for an Indian meal)? Would you like to go (dancing) with me?
