

Verb + to... (decide to... /forget to..., etc.)

After the following verbs, you can use to...: Offer, decide, hope, deserve, promise, agree, plan, manage, afford, threaten, refuse, arrange, fail, forget, and learn. We also use to... after seem, appear, tend, pretend, and claim. After dare or need, you can use a verb with or without to.

We need arrange a special meeting.

I would not dare say a bad word.

After some verbs, you can use a question word (what/whether/how, etc.)+to... We use this structure especially after ask, decide, know, remember, forget, learn, understand, wonder, explain.

I do not know whether to sign up for the event.

Do you understand how to get to the supermarket?

Have you decided how much money you want to invest?
